
GP12 King Kong Grice's coil o'rope and garter ribs gansey

This is a radical re-think of GP12, based on a high-definition scan of the original Olive Edis negative recently obtained from Cromer Museum. We can now see how the panels between the cables are formed – of 2-stitch garter ribs. This motif is also used in GP17.

The cables cross 19 times in the height of the yoke. Counting garter stitch rows there are 190, so crossing every 10 rows. The cables are 4 over 4. On the right below is the detail of the arm, showing the 2-stitch garter rib (upside down, as arms are knitted from the top down).
